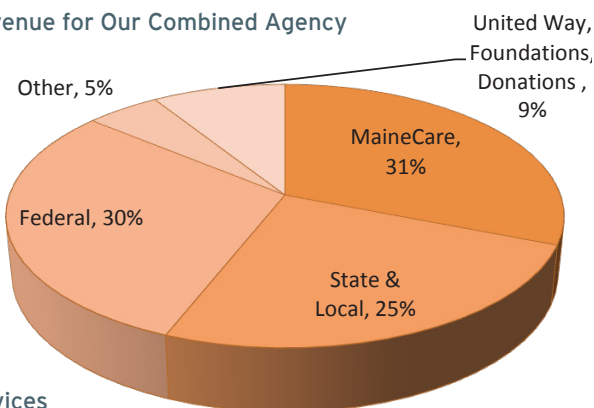


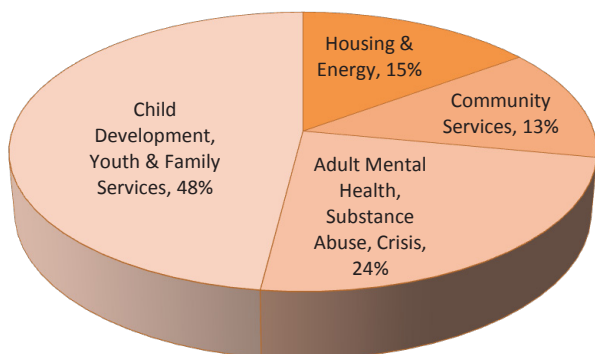
A Combined PROP - YI Benefits the Entire Community The Opportunity Alliance

- offers a strong advocate for our most vulnerable neighbors: *The Opportunity Alliance*, advocates for and with people living in poverty, families in need of reunification, and people living with mental illness and substance use disorders.
- addresses the root causes of poverty: *The Opportunity Alliance* helps people living in poverty by addressing its root causes and providing tools for self sufficiency, such as support in accessing healthcare, child care and early education, housing, and nutrition.
- offers a seamless continuum of services: *The Opportunity Alliance* offers services and supports to people living with persistent and chronic mental illness by creating an integrated, seamless system of care where people may access our services through multiple channels, yet need only tell their story once.
- strengthens communities: *The Opportunity Alliance* is proactive and efficient in developing community solutions that are effective, collaborative and that have measurable impact on clients and neighborhoods.
- offers effective solutions in difficult economic times: *The Opportunity Alliance* helps to deliver maximum mission impact with lower administrative costs. Residential Programs

- MaineStay:** Portland; young adults, ages 18 - 25.
- Edgewood:** Scarborough; youth ages 16 - 21.
- The Bridge:** Portland; emergency residence for homeless adults.
- Gordon Green:** South Portland; Elderly adults with mental illness and disabilities.
- Helen Winslow Ray House:** South Portland; Adults with a major mental illness.
- Morrison Place at Randall Street:** Portland; Homeless adults with co-occurring (mental health/substance abuse) disorders.
- Heath House:** Saco; Adults with developmental disabilities.

Community Supports

- Mediation Services:** Free mediation services.
- Maine Families:** Free home visitation and parenting education for first-time parents with newborns.
- Homeless Youth Services:** Advocacy and case management.
- Juvenile Behavioral Health Services:** Clinical services for youth residing at the Long Creek-Youth Development Center.
- Community Alternatives Program:** Case management for youth involved in the juvenile justice system.
- Children's Case Management:** Case management for children with a serious mental health disturbance.
- Parenting Education:** Low-barrier services and supports.
- Young Parent Program:** Education, socialization, housing, and support.
- Treatment Foster Care:** Foster care for children in DHHS custody.
- Multidimensional Treatment Foster Care:** Evidence-based program to support foster parents of delinquent teens.
- 2-1-1 Maine:** Maine's health and human services information and referral system.
- High Fidelity Wraparound:** Works with families who have children at risk of out-of-home placement.
- Supported Visiting:** Provides supervised visits for child protective clients in York County.

Mental Health Services

- Community Support Services:** Adult case management.
- Outpatient Services:** Psychiatric services for adults and children.
- Acute Care Services:** Crisis follow-up and counseling.
- Broadway Crossings:** Short-term therapeutic residential alternative to hospitalization for adults experiencing a mental health crisis.
- Mobile Outreach:** 24-hour response for adults, families and children during a mental health crisis, accessed through 774-HELP.
- State Street House:** 24-hour support for homeless men with co-occurring disorders in early recovery.

Child & Family Services

- Early Head Start, Head Start, Child Care:** Early childhood programs for qualifying families in Cumberland County.
- East End Kids Katering:** Provides meals to Head Start locations in Portland area.
- Mental Health Services:** For children ages birth to 20.
- Women, Infants & Children Program (WIC):** Provides food, nutrition education, and breast feeding support.

Community Initiatives

- Communities Promoting Health Coalition:** Partners with community groups, local governments and schools to advocate for healthy lifestyles.
- Community Services Case Management:** Case management for clients of PROP's services and supports.
- General Assistance Administration:** Administers funds to income eligible individuals.
- Homelessness Prevention Rapid Re-housing Program (HPRP):** Case management for homeless adults in partnership with Preble Street.
- Home Ownership Education Program:** Courses to assist first-time home buyers.
- Parkside Neighborhood Center:** The Center's programming adapts to emerging needs in the Parkside neighborhood of Portland.
- The Women's Project:** Statewide program for women recovering from substance use disorders.
- Maine Youth Action Network:** Promotes youth involvement in school and community-based peer programs statewide.
- Foster Grandparent Program:** Volunteers age 55 and older work with children with special needs.
- Senior Companion Program:** Volunteers age 55 and older work with frail elders.

- PROP's Housing and Energy Services provide relief for income eligible households in heating and energy costs, affordable housing, and repair or replacement of household heating and energy equipment.
